Dear Parents and Carers,

#### **Lateral Flow Testing**

As you are aware, all staff are taking twice weekly lateral flow tests. I am delighted to inform you that all tests taken to date have returned a negative result.

#### **Pupil Interactions during Zoom Lessons**

We have had some feedback that teachers are not acknowledging all of the pupils during lessons on zoom. Please be aware that teachers will try to acknowledge your child when they join the zoom before the lesson starts. When they are teaching using the flipchart and/or slides you cannot always see the whole class as the video images obstruct the view of the teaching slides. Please can you reassure your children that this is not intentional.

#### **Get Help with Technology**

To date, we have loaned several laptops, data SIM cards to families that require additional support with technology. If you need additional support please contact the school so that we can help your child access online learning.

#### Half Term...

Guidance was released from the Department for Education this week stating **that all schools will close as usual over February half-term** and are not expected to remain open to vulnerable children and the children of critical workers during that week. The school will continue to follow the agreed term dates, unless we receive a further directive from the DfE. Remote learning will not be set for your children during half term.



- The emphasis is to be alongside and have fun, even if they do not win the game or things don't quite go to plan.



Article 24 – Health care ensures that every child has the right to the best possible health

Article 28 - Every child has the right to an education
