Letter from the Chair of Governors, John Bale

Dear Parent/Carer,

May I firstly take this opportunity to thank you for the immense efforts to maintain the high standards of home learning and supporting your children to engage.

Governors have been exploring the benefits and opportunities of working within the structure of a multi academy trust (MAT). I am now writing to give you an update on our findings following extensive research.

The working group conclusion and feedback to the governing body recommended that:

- SJH would benefit greatly from joining a MAT where sharing school improvement practices will accelerate improvements in standards of teaching, learning and student outcomes.
- WCPS is best placed remaining as a Local Authority maintained school and develop networking both across the local group of maintained primary schools and beyond to build on the external links developed by the Head Teacher.

The recommendation has been endorsed by the governing body; this decision means there will be a need for our schools to de-federate and operate separately in the future. Please be assured the schools will continue to work closely together on joint strategies and shared facilities, although it will be outside of the formal federated arrangement currently in place.

The outcome of our discussions has been shared with the Local Authority and the Regional Schools Commissioner, who both support the recommendation. We are now preparing the plan for consulting on the proposal. Please be assured that we will keep you fully informed of these plans and the impact they may have on you, your children and the wider community.

I will write to you again, after the half term break, with further developments.
