#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

I hope that you all had a restful half term, even though the country was in a national lockdown. We were delighted to hear, as I am sure you were, that schools will be reopening on March 8<sup>th</sup> for all Primary year groups.

We will be so thrilled to welcome all of our children back to school and our plans are now underway for a safe reopening. I intend to communicate our plans to you early next week but please know that they won't be vastly different (if at all) from when we opened in September.

World Book day approaches and will take place this year on Thursday 4th March.

We still want to celebrate the day and promote a love of reading, in a whole school approach. As schools will not reopen fully until Monday 8th March, the usual events that we celebrate the day with, will need to be adjusted.

Our plans for the day are:

#### **Christmas Food Bank Feedback**

Before the Christmas break, Miss Russell and school council organised for each year group to donate food to support our local food bank Four Greens. A huge well done to Miss Russell and School Council for their hard work.

#### We contributed a massive 969KG of food!!

Number of emergency food hampers and emergency food parcels delivered to the local PL5 community for people in food poverty and those most isolated: 169

Weight of food your school contributed 969kg - This equates in weight terms to over 30 families being able to be fed for a week. An amazing effort

Over 72 families just from Whitleigh supported

Aware of at least ten families who have children at your school and this may not be all of the families being supported

Approximate value of food donated if needed to be purchase guestimated at £1055

#### What difference did it make?

An 82 year old lady received a parcel because her husband had died three months earlier and five weeks before Christmas was diagnosed with cancer. No local family and so alone at Christmas - In a card she sent it said the following:

" this has been an incredibly hard year and at times was wondering if it was worth carrying on. However, when you receive such a wonderful surprise two days before Christmas and know that the food has been donated by the local community it restores your faith in life"

Your contributions made the above possible and I really hope you can share this with everyone at the school.

I really hope we can resume our working relationship as we come out of lockdown and trust the above highlights our appreciation
