Attendance Focus

Persistent Absence

A pupil is identified as a 'persistent absentee' when they miss 10% or more schooling across the school year.

Absence at this level is considerably limiting any child's educational prospects. At Whitleigh Community Primary School, we want to support families to the help reduce this level of absence and therefore provide the best access to learning. In the coming weeks, you will receive letters notifying you of your child's absence percentage. Should you wish to discuss this percentage and ways to improve this, please come to speak to Mrs Roberts or Miss Sluggett.

How many days off will make your child persistently absent?	
Term 1	3.5 days absence from September until October half term
Terms 1 - 2	7 days absence from September - Christmas
Terms 1 - 3	10 days absence from September - February
Terms 1 – 4	12.5 absence school from September - Easter
Terms 1 – 5	15.5 days absence from September - May
Terms 1 – 6	19 days absence over the entire academic year
